

Announcement of the Ernst-Otto Czempiel Award 2023

The Peace Research Institute Frankfurt (PRIF) awards the best monograph in international peace research published between 2020 and 2022

The Peace Research Institute Frankfurt invites submissions for the Ernst-Otto Czempiel Award for peace research. The award, in honor of PRIF's former director, is endowed with 5,000 Euros and will be given for the best monograph published in the field of international peace research between 2020 and 2022. In addition to typical academic books, shorter monographs as well as books oriented at a broader, non-academic readership are also very welcome. Published Ph.D. theses are excluded.

Nominations and self-nominations are possible. Every nomination should contain the name, full address, and e-mail address of the author and the title of the book. In the case of self-nominations, the application should also contain a CV, a list of publications, and a copy of the book (if possible electronic). The deadline for nominations is December 1, 2022.

The winner will be selected by a scientific jury.
