



Figure 1a: Clinton and Bush Presidency – results of all categories

Figure 1b: Clinton and Bush Presidency – results of all categories in aggregated form








Figure 2a: Clinton Presidency – results of all categories









Figure 3a: Bush Presidency – results of all categories
